## Recap of the Month (Alex Ruhmann and Susan Wagner)

- $5^{\text {th }}$ grade events seem to be going really well; Thoreau pool party seems to be the right venue/program.
- Flow of $5^{\text {th }}$ grade events seems better without the Freedom Trail event in June (they attended the Boston Tea Party Museum this year instead) and Service Day in the fall.
- Room Parents sent out emails about end-of-year teacher gifts.
- Willard Carnival was amazing! A huge thanks goes to Erika Woodhouse. Any questions about the change in format for next year should be directed to Alex.
- Bracelets for retiring teachers are being distributed tomorrow.


## Communications (Sam Jaddou and Kathryn Watson)

- The card sort exercise at the volunteer party was helpful.
- Discussed having parents opt in every year so there's a clean set of data every year.
- Planning to send a housekeeping email to families (i.e. please update child(ren)'s grade(s), delete if you no longer want to receive Willard Weekly, etc.) - maybe August or around open house is the right timing?
- At some point we do have to communicate to returning/incoming families - once class assignments have been communicated, an email should go out with Matt Lucey's announcements, Room Parent signup genius, dates for open house, back-to-school nights, ice cream social, welcome coffee, school photo day, directory fee, etc.
- Alex still working on Committee Guidelines.

Before and After (Denise Carleton and Jaimee Healy)

- Nothing new to report. It was a good year with a lot of parent involvement.
- It is still TBD how choir will be run next year. It likely should be a school-run program, run just like band. If we call it a PTG event, then technically it falls under the PTG's insurance policy, which means taking the students on a bus away from school (i.e. Big Sing concert) would not be allowed.
- We will continue to keep an eye on the Thoreau School / Concord Recreation partnership - it wasn't totally well-received, i.e. there are parents who are still interested in running programs, teachers are now getting paid through the Rec. Dept., which is a different model, but several upsides, too.


## Fundraising (Marieke Herrero and Peony Keve)

- Annual Appeal grossed just over $\$ 34,000$, but the net was just under given PayPal fees, for example.
- We are going to restart as a 501 c 3 , which should reduce the PayPal fees going forward.


## Treasurer's Report (Kristin Martines)

- Early indications suggest that income from the Willard Carnival appears to be right where it should be.
- Coffee budget is around $\$ 2,300$ vs. over $\$ 3,000$ this time last year — it was wise to give the management responsibility to Sherry and Bev.
- Cost for Math Olympiad was a surprise because a staff member was added and we hadn't planned to pay for two people. The second person was not officially approved; Matt may need a reminder about the process.


## Willard Carnival (Erika Woodhouse)

- The event went really well. Still waiting on some expenses, but the revenue numbers look good. It appears that we are right on target, if not a little higher.
- Takeaways:
- An inventory was taken of everything that went back in the pod - we can make decisions about what we want to do with remaining items.
- There has been some good energy among the community about what might come next and lots of ideas being batted around - maybe we capitalize on that energy and host some brainstorming sessions in the early fall?


## Social Events (Meagan MacNutt)

- Kristen and Darcy Heintz-Perkins hosted the Kindergarten Popsicle Party. They were wonderful and helpful hosts with a beautiful backyard. Approximately 20 kids in attendance. It would be nice to have more people come, but it still feels like an event worth holding.
- Volunteer Party was also lightly attended - 46 'yes' RSVPs out of 130 invites. All of the food was consumed; West Concord Liquors took back maybe half of the wine.
- Parent Social:
- May have a host lined up for the Parent Social.
- Desired timing is early October. Ideally a date can be finalized in time to include with back-toschool info.
- Considering the return of a food truck to the Parent Social. Discussed some other new ideas to include: charging for food, selling tickets for booze, offering hard alcohol, hiring an additional bartender for liability of alcohol, offering a signature cocktail since people are trending toward hard alcohol, hosting a cash bar for hard alcohol, selling drink tickets.
- Silent auction will be held at the Parent Social.
- It could be fun to use some of the carnival games, i.e. bean toss for yard.
- Will hold a separate meeting to discuss the repurposing of carnival stuff.
