

# Willard PTG Meeting

September 14, 2020

### <u>Attendance</u>

• Janet welcomes everyone to first meeting, grateful for our time because the current situation is nuts!

#### Approve Minutes (Janet King)

• Motion to approve March minutes, Alex seconds. Minutes are approved.

### Teacher Fund (Janet King)

- Janet proposed an increase to the Teacher Fund from \$9110 to \$12,000
- These are classroom funds allowing staff to buy whatever will help them teach. If teachers go through the district it can take a long time. PTG reimburses after they submit their receipts.
- Liz seconds the motion. Motion is approved.

### Principal's Report (Matt Lucey)

- 87% of kids are back in the building a great start!
- Reminds us that the planning began last May and Willard was able to open even if it looks a lot different thanks to so many individuals. Asks what questions the PTG has/feedback from parents
- Alex voices the concern that teachers have to park far away. Lucey explains the need for year-round surface. Staff can drop off their bags and supplies.



- First fire drill will be this morning at 10.15, the only time kids don't use designated doors.
- There hasn't been a single mask issue.
- Reminder that school is rolling out the technology for each student, and asking for people's patience.
- This week was about getting kids back in door and feeling safe. The school has so far avoided illnesses.
- Alex asks about the plan if there is not a spike in cases, for Willard to go back full-time. Willard can go all remote if needed, or quickly move forward to more students in-person. Next chance to reevaluate will come in November.
- Biggest challenge will be lunch, which likely can't happen until a vaccine. The other big challenge is Specials teachers who would be "super spreaders", teaching all 417 students.
- Darcy passes on the gratitude that parents are feeling.
- Half the students are being driven. It has been slow, safe, and good!
- Susannah asks about the COVID screening check-in app. Willard did not register for the app (an added expense). Lucey believes there is an option at high school to use a smart device and will let people know how to do this.
- New staff: Alison Corwin in front office. New K teacher Tatiana Cochis. Elise LaCroix is covering 4<sup>th</sup> grade this year for Robin McManus. Amy Delaney is a long-term sub.

# Fundraising (Susannah Benner)

- In lieu of Parent Social, Susannah suggests selling pinwheels in green and white school colors. These would be 9 inches wide mylar
- Alcott and Thoreau could participate with their school colors. The effort would create school spirit and unite students at home with those learning in-person
- Ordering 500 costs \$2,000; price-point for selling is debated, somewhere between \$10 and \$15. Would need to sell 120 to 160 to break even.



- Idea is proposed to package these for businesses like Sorrentos.
- Lucey loves the idea: visible and creative. It could be a town-wide effort if Fenn, CMS etc. come on board
- Payment would be through Paypal, contactless
- Discussion of option to purchase for families who can't afford the pinwheels. There would need to be a sign-up mechanism and a way for these families to pick up, which the Counselor would have to coordinate
- 2 Directory ads have sold for a total of \$625 with other potential ads in the works. We should meet the goal of \$1600.

- Meagan MacNutt and Darcy Heintz-Perkins had the idea to offer a bottle of wine/boxed dinner and do individual class Zoom nights.
- Room parents could set up each Zoom. Room parents will be filled by Tuesday September 15.
- The Auction has been tabled until November/December. Alex cautions that auctions do better in person because it's more social. Susannah points to other online versions that have done well.
- Need to look into legal rules: an online raffle is gambling under federal law but an online auction is not.
